Project Background



Q Street and 30th Street are important South Omaha corridors serving nearby homes, businesses, and community destinations.

The corridor is scheduled for improvements through the City's regular street maintenance program, with additional grant funding dedicated to pedestrian safety. Along with resurfacing the roadway, the project will also evaluate narrow sidewalks, traffic speeds, and crash history to identify ways to improve safety and how the corridor functions.




Vulnerable User Crashes



A study completed in 2022 identified vulnerable user crashes as a major concern in this neighborhood. The map shows numerous crashes documented with pedestrians or bicycles on Q Street and the surrounding road network.

Vision Zero has classified this length of Q Street as a Priority #1 corridor to take action on. This project aims to remove Q Street from the Vision Zero High-Injury Network.

Project Details

Funding for this project comes from the City's regular street maintenance program and special grants dedicated to pedestrian safety. In addition to street resurfacing and pavement replacement, the City of Omaha is considering the following to address high crash rates and community concerns about speeding, safety and accessibility.

Project elements being evaluated include:

-  Traffic calming devices to reduce speeding
-  Sidewalk improvements to meet ADA accessibility requirements and connect to the neighborhood
-  Intersection and pedestrian crossing enhancements to improve safety
-  Drainage improvements and utility coordination to match with the street and sidewalk upgrades
-  Driveway access and curb improvements for homes and businesses
-  Streetscape and landscape features where appropriate

What We've Heard

Previous planning efforts and community feedback have highlighted several concerns along Q Street and 30th Street that are helping guide this project. Residents, businesses, and corridor users have shared challenges related to safety, comfort, and the overall condition of the street and sidewalks.

Key issues raised include:



Vehicle speeds and driver behavior along the corridor



Safety concerns at intersections and crossings



Accessibility challenges for people walking and using mobility devices



Driveway access and visibility for nearby businesses and homes



Aging pavement and uninviting sidewalk conditions









Drainage issues and standing water after rain events
