Q Street & 30th Street Improvements Project

The City of Omaha is advancing improvements along Q Street between 27th and 36th Streets and along 30th Street between Washington Street and Q Street. Community feedback and project evaluation helped identify priorities for the corridor, and the project team has developed design concepts focused on improving safety, accessibility, and connectivity for people walking, biking, driving, and accessing nearby homes and businesses.

The proposed improvements aim to create a safer, more comfortable, and more connected corridor for all users.

Proposed Improvements

Safety Enhancements

- Intersection improvements at 30th Street and 33rd Street
- Enhanced pedestrian crossings
- Traffic calming measures to support safer travel

Accessibility Improvements

- New and widened sidewalks
- ADA-compliant curb ramps and crossings

- Improved pedestrian connections throughout the corridor

Corridor Improvements

- Driveway access enhancements
- New street lighting
- Storm sewer and drainage improvements
