

## Welcome!

The purpose of today’s meeting is to present preliminary design, answer questions and receive your input.

The City of Omaha Public Works Department is planning to reconstruct 156th Street from W. Maple Road to Fort Street to a four-lane roadway, divided by a median.

### Planned Improvements Include:

- Widening (primary purpose)
- Multi-use trail
- Safety enhancements such as improved pedestrian crossings, crash-reduction features, and roundabouts
- ADA accessibility improvements
- Storm water management improvements

### Project Purpose:

The purpose of the project is to reduce congestion and improve mobility along 156th Street between West Maple Road and Fort Street.



### Project Need:

156th Street between W. Maple Road and Fort Street currently lacks the capacity to accommodate existing traffic or future growth, resulting in congestion within a rapidly developing area. Improvements are needed to support safer and more efficient travel for all users, including people driving, walking, and biking. A 10-foot multi-use trail will be included on the west side of N. 156th St, with a protected crossing midway through the corridor to allow for safe connection to the Westin Hills Park Trail and increased mobility for the area. The project also includes upgrades to ADA accessibility, expanded sidewalk connections, and improved storm water drainage to help reduce the risk of localized flooding.

Input gathered now from users of the corridor will help guide the decisions about how these improvements are designed and implemented.



Signalized Alternative




Roundabout Alternative




